What's So Special About The Sixties?

Each generation makes a special contribution to the world and takes with it a reputation. The 1960's were a decade of change for the United States. In addition to the explosion of Rock and Roll and fashion statement of mini-skirts, political movements such as the Civil Rights Struggle and the Nation's involvement in the Vietnam War made headlines. Small towns were not exempt from the impact of these changes but in many respects they were much more gentle in their impact.

One area which everyone remembers with fondness is the trucks of the 1960's. Area farmers were buying their first brand new Chevy Truck. And for many of those who purchased trucks in the 1960's a love affair of sorts began that was passed on to their children. In fact, many of these original 1960 trucks are still in use by their original owners and their children.

John Smotherman bought his new truck in 1965, maroon in color, he was riding fancy for a farmer. John kept his truck for the next 20 years and a couple

of months ago he sold the truck to an enthusiast in LaVergne. As what often happens, John was more attached to his truck than he realized. After a week, he missed the old truck so much that he went and bought it back. Today it sits in his backyard with flat

tires. It is no longer operational, but it is still there.

Thomas Kelly Vaughn bought his '66 Chevrolet truck in October of 1965. He drove it for two decades when he replaced it with a new one in 1986. The truck may have been old in 1986, but it was far from retirement as Thomas Kelly "handed" it down to his son, Jim Vaughn. Jim drove his "vintage" truck to school in 1991 and 1992. Beginning in 1992, the truck has been used infrequently for farm use but most of the time it remains in the garage.



Harry Patillo purchased his first new silver metallic, custom deluxe, Chevy truck in 1966. This impressive vehicle made a quite a statement on the roadways. In 1974, Mr. Harry passed his pride and joy on to son John Thomas. John Thomas continues to drive his 1966 truck, using it on the farm, for fun for hauling tools. "A man and his truck, it's a beautiful thing" is best illustrated in the story related below.

Gloria Hill reports that: "A couple of winters back on a Saturday morning, John pulled in at the shop (Farm Sales & Service) in his ole '66 truck. He didn't say a word - he just pulled the old thing right on up into the shop. As usual, there were a few Saturday loafers standing around: Carl Scott, Dennis Harris, Kenneth Boyce, Chris Kieffer, David Greasley, and probably two or three more. There was a light snow that morning and John had been in an accident. He was turning off of Hwy 41A onto Webb

Lions Sight Screening

The Eagleville Lions Club participated in the Health Fair at the recent Native American Powwow held at MTSU. The Tennessee Conference of the United Methodist Church sponsored the Health Fair. Centennial Medical Center conducted diabetes screening and the Lions from Eagleville and Smyrna performed sight and hearing screening.

On average, Native Americans are 2.2 times more likely to have diabetes than whites of a similar age and 27% of southeastern Native Americans have been diagnosed with diabetes. Diabetic retinopathy, cataracts and glaucoma are among the leading complications associated with diabetes.

In its earliest stages, diabetic eye disease often shows no symptoms and most people are unaware that they could be going blind. If untreated, vision loss or blindness may result. This is one of the groups of people that your Lions Club is trying to reach with sight-saving information. Regular eye exams are necessary to detect eye disease and treatment by a professional is necessary to correct these problems

Road to go feed his cows but the ole truck didn't turn when he cut the wheels. It just went straight into the guardrail. John's truck has a tool box in the very back that weighs over a ton. That makes the front end light, so he had no control. Into the guardrail he went, crushing his right front fender and pushing the bumper back into the wheel bursting out the head-light. He was able to tie the bumper to the guardrail with a chain and back up so the bumper came away from the wheel enough to make it to the shop. To say John was sick is putting it mildly. Anyone who knows John Patillo knows how much he loves that old truck. I was up front, at the time, with customers but when I was finally able to go back in the shop, I saw a sight I will never forget. All these men were standing around the front of John's truck looking at the sad sight of the bent up front end with John in the center. No one was saying a word. It looked like a "funeral for the old '66 Chevy".

Urban Scales purchased his new 1963 Chevy for \$1,560. In 1966 he bought a 64 Chevy truck from Mr. John Bellenfant for \$475. For 30 years, Mr. Urban made good use of that '64 truck as a service truck for the busi-

ness he built in 1954. Both trucks are still running. Urban is pictured with the 1964 truck.

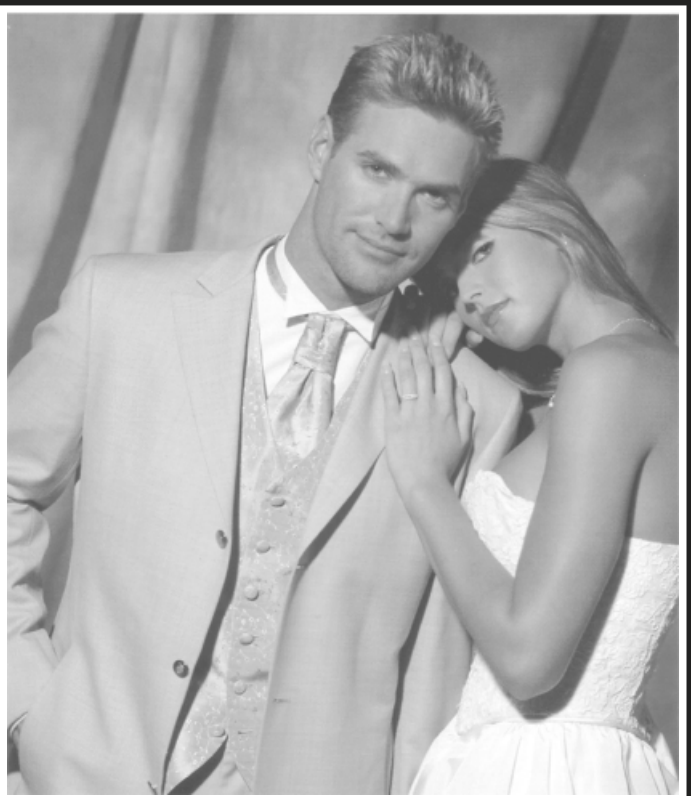

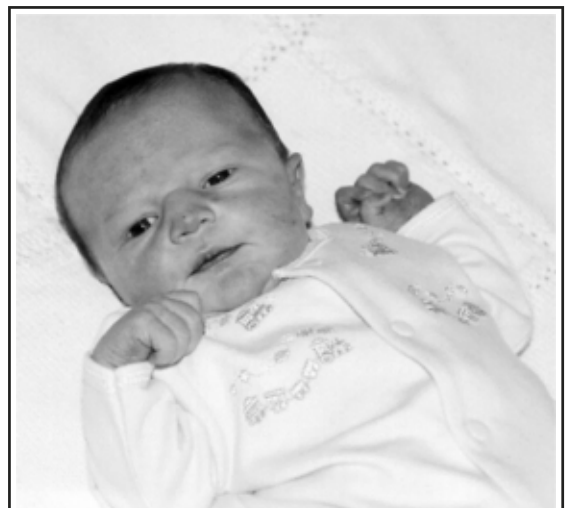
Diane went over to see

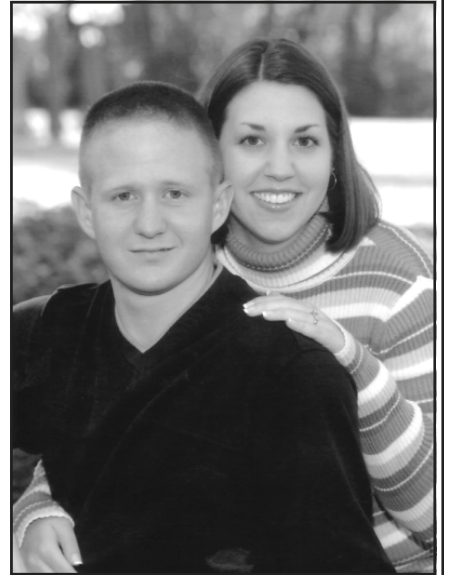

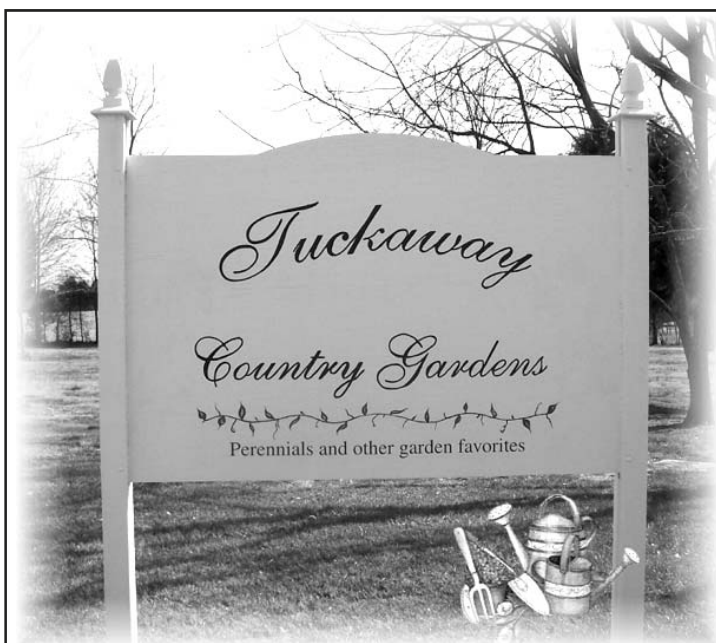
River Oak Swim Club Shines At 2005 Southeast District East Championship

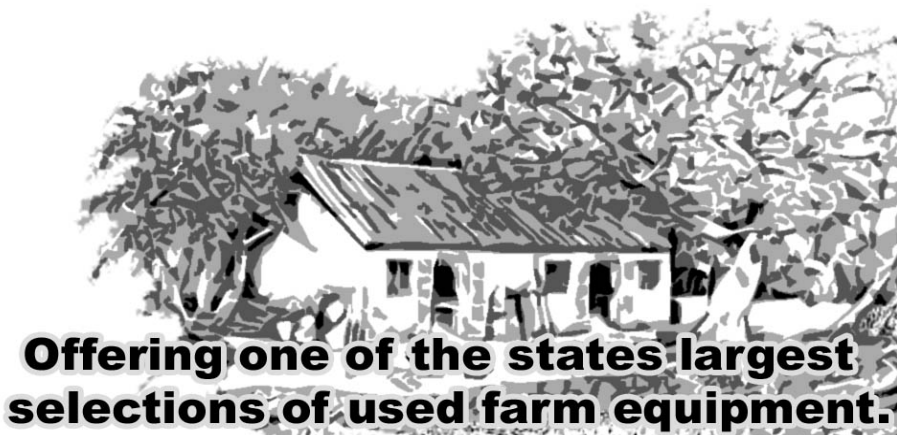

50th Wedding Anniversary

David Marion Hay better known as "Buddy" was born in Eagleville, November 30th, 1922 and has lived most of his life here. He is the son of David Marion Sr. "Jew Baby" and Sudie Margarette Vaughan Hay. Buddy graduated from Eagleville HS, in 1942 and attended a year at UT, Knoxville and a year at Aeronautical Engineering in Los Angeles, California.

In 1945 Buddy was working at the N.C. & St. L. Railroad in West Nashville and was in training to learn machine shop and was an apprentice machinist. He was living

with his Granny Vaughan near the railroad yards in Nashville, helping take care of her while her son, Will T. Vaughan, Buddy's uncle, was serving in the US Army.

One Sunday afternoon, Buddy was returning from his parent's home in Eagleville to his Granny's house and he always drove through Centennial Park. On this particular Sunday afternoon he saw someone he knew. He stopped to chat with Frances Quarles, whose father had been a pastor of the Eagleville Methodist Church. Frances and her good friend, Irene Sulser, were student nurses at St. Thomas School of Nursing and had come to the park that afternoon for a change of scenery. Buddy was introduced to Irene, thus started a courtship that ended in marriage on June 22, 1946 at the West End Methodist Church Chapel in Nashville.

Irene was born February 11, 1925 in Taft, Tn. (Lincoln County) and is the daughter of George Washington and Bertha McCluskey Sulser. She graduated from Blanche HS in 1943 and St. Thomas School of Nursing in 1946.

After their marriage, Buddy continued at the railroad and after his apprentice work was completed, they bought a grocery store in south Nashville. They relocated to another grocery just off Nolensville Road. They sold this store in 1950 and moved back to Eagleville and Buddy joined his father in farming, raising up to 20 acres of tobacco, milking dairy cows and raising beef cattle. He continued farming until he went to work for GE in Murfreesboro and continued in tool and die at GE for almost 10 years. He was employed at Samsonite where he helped build the vat where the chairs were dipped in a rust proof solution and coated, ready to dry and be put on the market. After working at Samsonite, he was employed at the Doug Nash Co., in Franklin where he inspected blue prints of parts before they were made and he supervised the heat-treating of them. After this firm closed, Buddy and his son, David, went into heavy construction work, grain bins and farming.

Irene started her first professional job as a registered nurse at St. Thomas Hospital on Hayes St., Nashville. Irene was traveling to Nashville working at St. Thomas as head nurse on the women's surgical floor and later held the assistant supervisor position on the medical floor for 11 years. In 1952 Irene had one of her nursing high-lights. She was taking care of Minnie Pearl's mother and one day Minnie Pearl put her arms around Irene and thanked her for taking care of her "sweet little mother". Being hugged by Minnie Pearl out in the busy hospital hall way was certainly a thrill for Irene. During the time Buddy was working at GE, he and Irene decided to quit going to work in two directions, so on December 26, 1961 Irene started to work at the Rutherford Hospital in Murfreesboro, which later became the Middle Tennessee Medical Center. Irene was very instrumental in the planning and building of a new MTM Same Day Surgery Unit. She was asked to plan and design the new unit. She and Buddy travel to other hospitals looking at their units and equipment until she was able to work out the plans and knew what equipment was needed. She got the unit all set up, started and worked in it until her retirement March 30, 1993, after 32 years of service. Irene's face was the first one a lot of people saw when they were waking up from surgery. A lot of time when she is in Murfreesboro she see people that remembers her from their surgery. 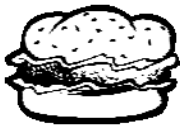

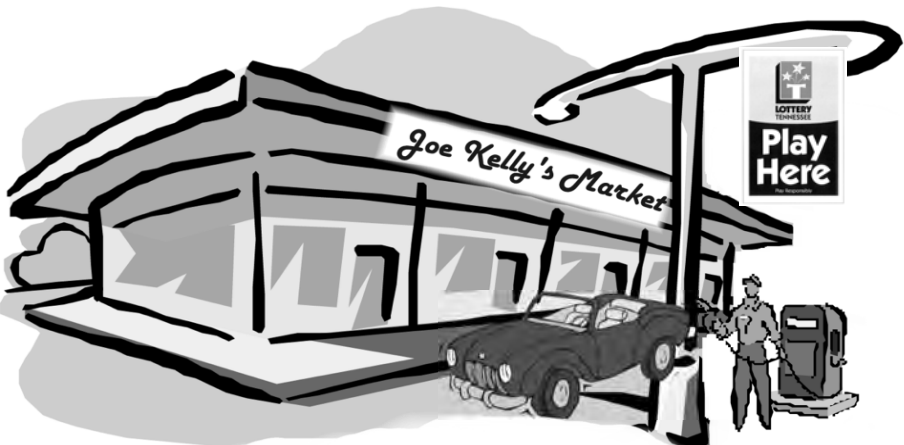

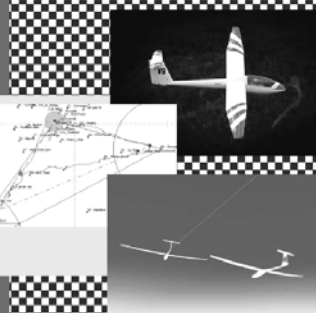

Don't have any eggs for a baking recipe? Use 2 tablespoons of corn oil plus 1 tablespoon of water as a substitute.

For making peaches easier to peel, drop them into a pot of boiling water and take them out after 1 minute. This also works for tomatoes-leave them in for 1 or 2 minutes, or until their skins split.

To sanitize cutting boards and countertops, use a mixture of 1 table-spoon bleach to 1 gallon of water.

12 large eggs
1/3 cup Sour Cream
1 lb. pork sausage
1/4 lb. (4 oz.) sliced fresh mushrooms
1 medium onion, chopped
2 medium tomatoes, chopped (about 1 cup)
2 cups Cheddar Cheese, shredded
2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese or Shredded Mozzarella Cheese

Preheat oven to 400°F. Beat eggs with sour cream with wire whisk until well blended. Pour into greased 13x9-inch baking dish. Bake 10 minutes or until egg mixture is softly set. Meanwhile, cook sausage, mushrooms and onions in large skillet until sausage is cooked through, stirring occasionally. Drain.

Reduce oven temperature to 325°F. Spoon tomatoes over the baked egg layer; top with the sausage mixture. Sprinkle with cheeses. Bake an additional 30 minutes or until egg mixture is set in center.

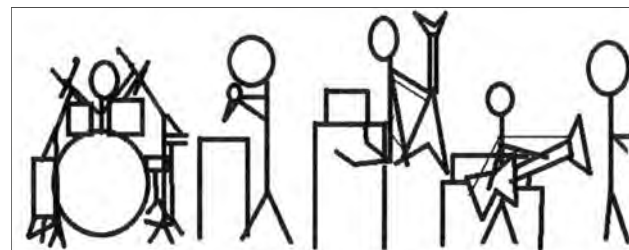

*Tune Out TV Violence on April 5
And Put Television To Work For Children*

WHEREAS, the National Association for Family and Community Education and its affiliate, Eagleville FCE, recognize that television is our story teller, our entertainer and our educator; and

WHEREAS, Eagleville FCE recognized that viewing television with a violent content is a significant factor in desensitizing children and adults toward the effects of violence; and

WHEREAS, children who watch a large number of violent programs tend to favor using aggression to resolve conflicts; and

WHEREAS, the vision of the National Association for Family and Community Education is for children to benefit from the television they watch.

THEREFORE, the National Association for Family and Community Education and its affiliate, Eagleville FCE, sets forth these resolutions:

- that children, parents and caregivers become aware of and choose alternatives to violent programming;
- that children, parents and caregivers discover the wonders of television instead of being influenced by senseless violence and other potentially harmful programming;
- that the Children's Television Act of 1990 be strengthened and enforced;
- that the National Association for Family and Community Education's Family ChoiceE-TV program help children to benefit from television.
