NEW MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND TRADITION

On Saturday of Memorial Day weekend, the Tractor Show grounds on Highway 99 opened the gates to a new type of pull, at least to many of us. The familiar TVPPA members were on hand with concessions. White soup beans with cornbread and loaded baked potatoes were popular choices for the lunch and dinner crowd. For those there early, a traditional country breakfast started the day. Homemade sweets, cookies, and pies were also enjoyed by children and adults alike.

The show grounds looked a little different than the usual tractor day. Along with tractors, the fields along the pulling track gave space to horse trailers; except, instead of horses, they were filled with teams of mules. In addition to tractor pulls, and duel tractor pulls held in the morning and late afternoon and evening, the event of the day was the Mule Pull. Teams of mules, from three different weight categories, strained against their harnesses to pull a sled, loaded with bricko block for weight. The mules were often difficult to control as they leaned

and strained into their task, not wanting to stop after the 10 feet required for a successful pull. Most of the teams traveled from the Columbia area and represented with pride their communities of Williamsport, Burrwood, and Theta.

The first weight class included 7 teams of mules. Each team's combined weight was between 500 and 900 pounds. The competition continued as each team pulled more and more weight. Until it was over, it was difficult to know who won since victory is not calculated on total weight pulled but on the weight pulled as compared with the total weight of the team. For this first class, Mr. Fred Shipp Jr. won first place. His team pulled 3.12 time their combined weight.

The second class had three teams of mules and the weight of each team ranged from 1200 to 1700 pounds. The mules not only competed with each other in their class, they were also competing with the other classes as the competition is based on the amount of weight pulled as compared to the total team weight. In this class, Mr. Fred Shipp Sr. asked for enough weight to be added so that he could

Freeland and Thomas Maupin are brothers who share a common love for music and dancing. They grew up and attended school in Eagleville. They are the sixth and seventh of 10 children of John D. and Mable Maupin. All children except Ollie B., who passed away in 2001, live within 20 miles of each other. Most of the Maupin family are well known for their music and dancing ability. They were taught the love of music and dancing at an early age by their grandmother Finley who lived with them. This family's talents are still being passed down to the grandchildren and great grandchildren of John D. and Mable.

Freeland was born Nov. 16th 1940. He has been married to Sarah, daughter of Paul and Emily Pauline Lowe for almost 46 years. They are parents of 2 children: Noland Antonio (Tony) and Sandra Renee and have 4 grandchildren and 1 step grandchild. They have lived in the Eagleville – Murfreesboro area all their married life and at the present live on S. Windrow Road near Eagleville.

Thomas was born November 16th, 1938. He married Beulah Shores almost 44 years ago and has two daughters, Deana and Danyael, and two grandchildren. Thomas retired from AVCO in 2000 after 41 ½ years of service. Thomas and Beulah live near Murfreesboro.

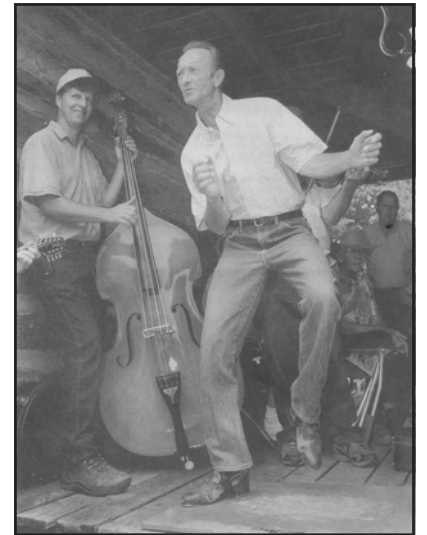
Thomas is a well-known five time national buck-dancing champion. He has been dancing as long as he can remember and has danced at "Uncle Dave Macon Days" in Murfreesboro every year but one of this 27-year tradition. He describes himself as a "self taught buck dancer with a flat foot style". Everyone likes to see Thomas put on his tap shoes and get out his plywood board. They know they're in for a treat. Thomas said that when he was young, people would want him to



"dance a little jig" for them and he was always ready to oblige. Maybe that's why buck dancing is called jig dancing in Kentucky. He won his first competition with a friend, Owen McConnell, in 1954 in a talent contest at the old theatre in Eagleville. Thomas has traveled and danced in competitions and exhibitions over most of the south and eastern part of the United States. They span from the Sunshine Park in New York to a street in Quebec Canada where he and Freeland danced

for an accordion player, to south on a street corner in New Orleans. He and Freeland have often traveled together and entered into competition with each other. Several years ago at the Dave Macon Days in Murfreesboro, Thomas, Freeland and their now deceased brother Ollie B., competed against each other. Ollie B. also shared the love of music and dancing with Thomas and Freeland. He was sick quite a while before his death and during his illness he gave his dancing shoes to Thomas. The shoes were too big and Thomas commented, "I can never fill his shoes, but I can dance in them". The first Dave Macon Days after Ollie B's death, Thomas danced in Ollie B's shoes. Although he used tape to keep them on, Thomas was dancing for his brother in his brother's shoes.

In about 1986 or 1987, Freeland and Thomas went to East View in West Tennessee for a dancing competition. This one and only time, Freeland came home with the 1st place plaque and money. Thomas came in second. Freeland has never let Thomas forget this trip. Thomas also remembers trips to Athens Alabama where a 93-year-old man beat him two years in a row. Thomas said his mother, Mable, never saw him dance in public but he had an aunt, Mary Sue Perrell who came to Dave Macon Days and watched him dance. He felt his Mother's presence when he looked out the audience and saw Aunt Sue.

Thomas is featured in a video showcase located in the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville. The video was filmed near Ft. Nashboro. He was dressed in the 30 or 40's style of clothing and was dancing on the street corner. He felt he was chosen because of his comments about how he feels that dancing has always been a part of music and the two have always gone together. Thomas believes that a good dancer feels the music and the music becomes a part of him. "You just have to feel it," he said. Thomas has recently been visited by a reporter from North Carolina

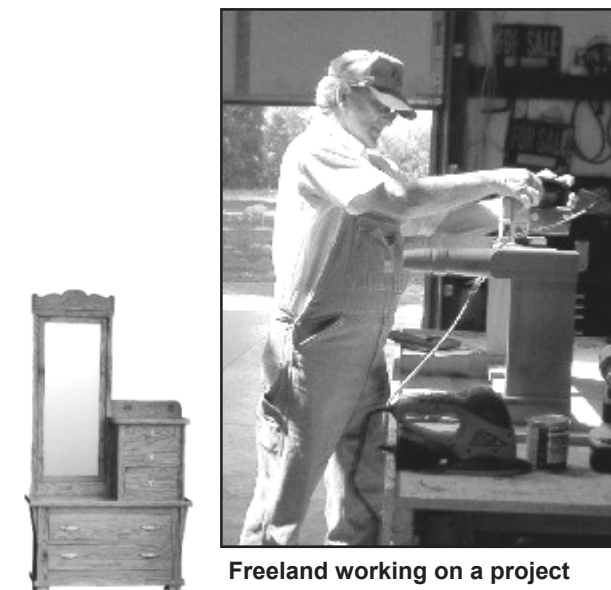

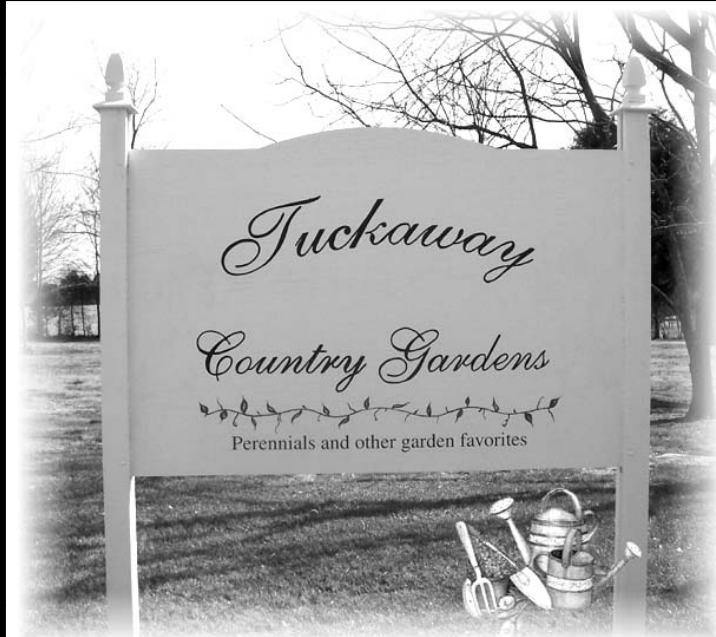

A Step Back in Time

I have been requested to write an article on three men who lived and worked in Eagleville all their life. Matter of fact they all worked until they were in their 90's and was connected to businesses next to each other for years. They are Mr. Richard Greenberry "Green" Hay, Mr. William Thomas "Bill" Lowe and Mr. Edward Leslie "Dr. Les" Williams. I knew and respected all three of these men. I wish I could talk with them today. What stories they could tell us about the early days of the Eagleville and surrounding area.

Richard Greenberry Hay, one of the remarkable citizens was the son of John Holland and Mary Catherine Rieves Hay. He was born July 1, 1868 and died May 14th 1967. He married January 5th 1897 to Martha E. Lewis of Walter Hill. She died in December of the same year. In 1902 he married Anna Virginia Elmore daughter of James William and Catherine Knott Elmore and had 4 children: Urban Owen and his twin brother who died in infancy, Mary Pearl and Peter. They lived

in the first house north of Regions Bank.

Mr. Hay's 79 years of business adventures included operating R. G. Hay Liv-
ery, Feed and Sale Stable in Eagleville for 21 years as well as "Little Green Hay's Big Hardware Store for approximately 58 years. This doesn't take into account the years he ran a horse drawn well drilling machine. He started in business at a very early age and remained in the hardware business until his death. The large two-story hardware store was on Main Street where Joyce's Beauty Shop is presently located. A large part of Eagleville's history has been lost as the older buildings were torn down. This happens to most small communities in time.

As a child, I remember going to "Little Green Hay's Big Hardware Store" but like a lot of people, I remember Mr. Green Hay and his derby hat more than the store. The derby hat was his trademark. He remarked in an interview that he had worn out at least 50 of them during his lifetime. He sensed the derby was going out of style, so he bought four more to last him.

In an interview in 1948 with a Nashville paper, Mr. Hay claimed that a customer had never asked for anything in the hardware line that "Little Green Hay's Big Hardware Store" could not supply. His store was described as having two aisles, like narrow canyons, cut through the stacks, shelves and racks of hardware which touch the ceiling of the store and Mr. Hay was described as a small, sprightly man, pattering up and down the aisles like a amiable magpie and wouldn't weigh more than 100 pounds soaking wet. He would more than likely have a chew of tobacco in his mouth. He stated he had probably chewed about 4000 pounds since the age of 6 when he first started chewing. "I get up early most every morning, get me a drink of water, take a chew of tobacco and go back to bed for awhile," he stated.

One of Mr. Hay's favorite stories was about the time he sold a pulpit. A Nashville hardware salesman bet a friend there wasn't anything he couldn't get

in this store. The friend came out to Eagleville to see. He asked Mr. Hay about buying a pulpit. Mr. Hay replied, "Sure, I've got a pulpit. Come over to my barn and I'll let you look at it." The friend couldn't believe his ears and lost the bet. Mr. Hay said the pulpit had belonged to a country church that had blown down in a high wind. The church folks stored it in his barn and gave it to him when they rebuilt and decided on a new pulpit.

Another story Mr. Hay liked to tell was about a man in Detroit, Michigan who was having difficulty finding exactly the logging chain he wanted. Not a store in Detroit had one. Somebody from Tennessee told him about Green Hay's and he call a friend in Nashville to investigate. "We had the chain, and it cost him fifty dollars to do all that calling around though," stated Mr. Hay.

Mr. Tom Floyd, Mr. Hay's nephew by marriage helped him in the store. Mr. Floyd stated in the newspaper article "during the war we sold half a dozen sets of buggy harness, but haven't moved any of them in 20 years, but we have them". He stated that Mr. Hay's idea is that if he doesn't have it, he'll get it for you and then keep it in stock on the theory that somebody else might want it too.

I'm sure there are many, many items sold in Little Green Hay's Big Hardware Store that aren't used in the present day but I'm also sure there are items bought in this store that are still being used in Eagleville and surrounding communities homes today.

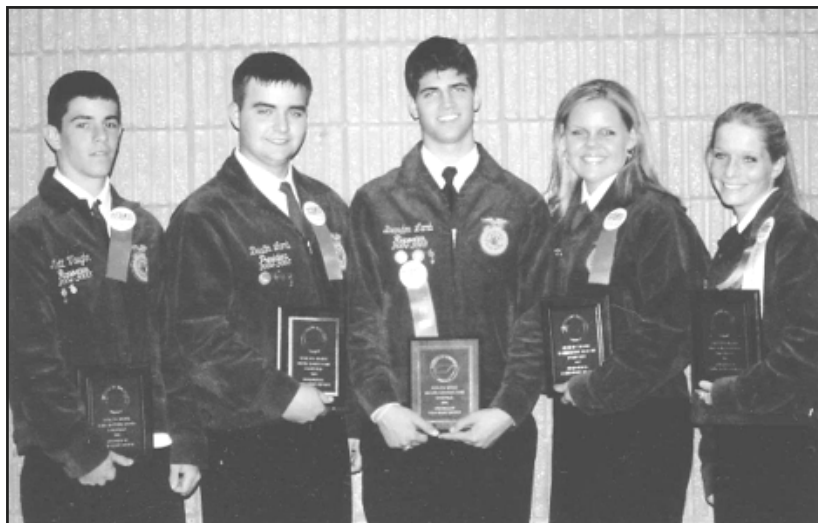

Senior Week and Activities

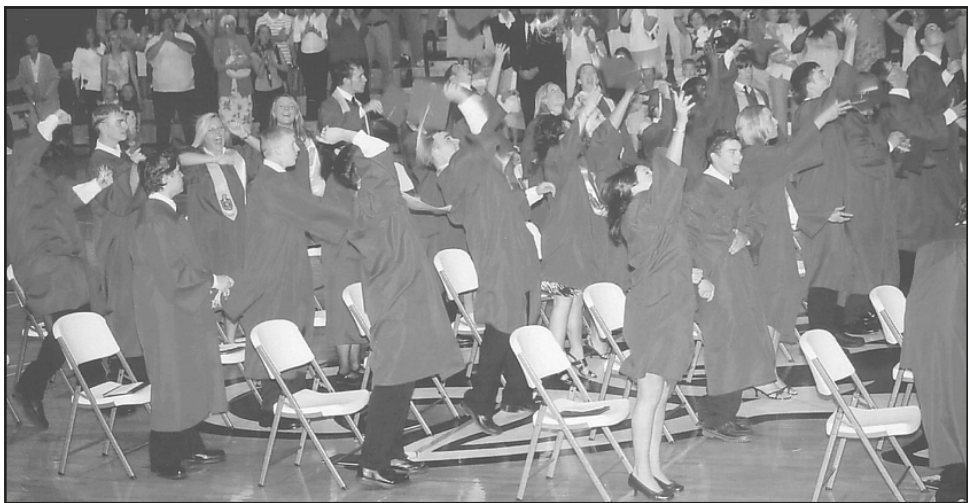
Monday—On Monday of Senior Week the high school took time out from 5th and 6th periods to enjoy the Senior Kickball game shown here.

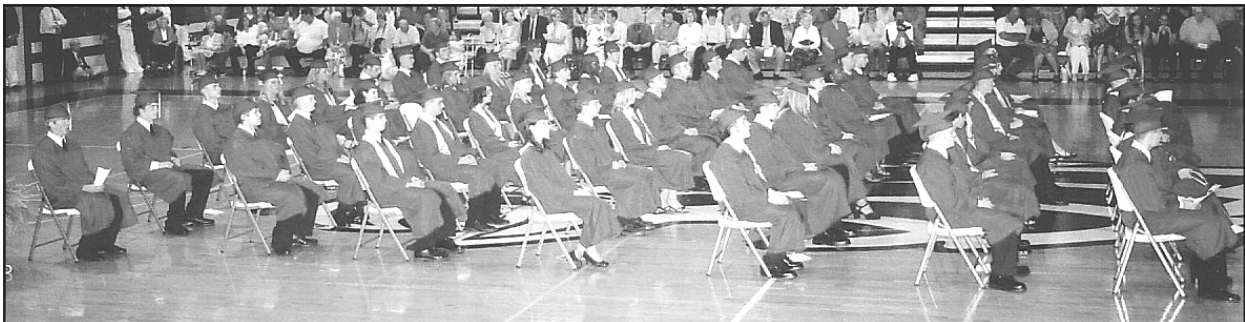

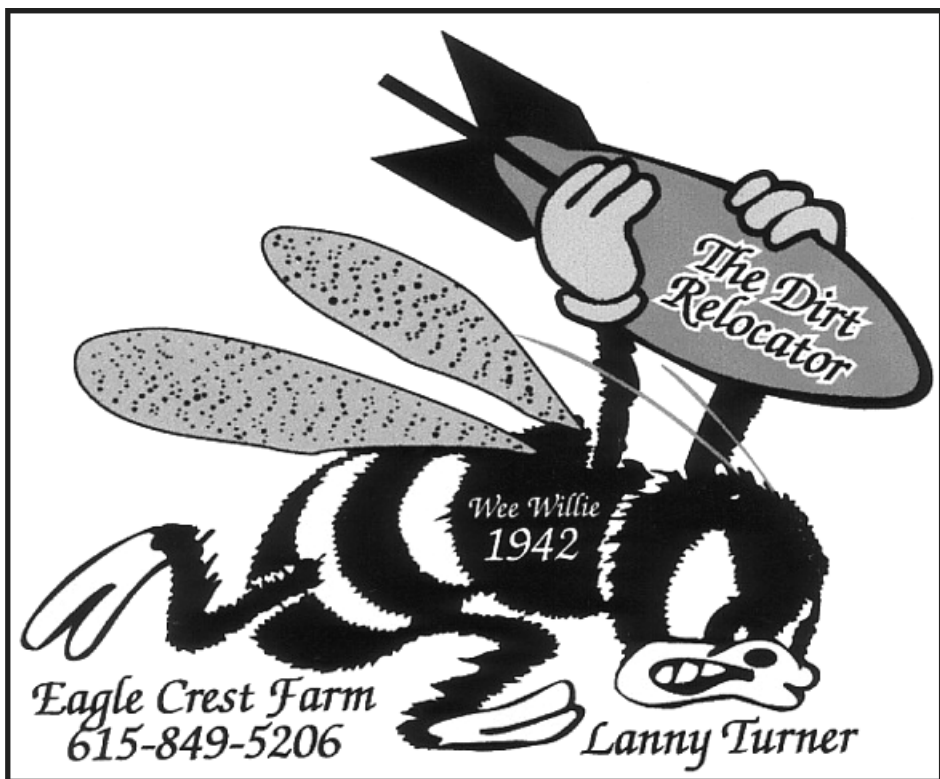

Accompanied by an ACLU-TN Attorney, Eagleville School Valedictorian Receives His Diploma

Wednesday, May 25, 2005 ACLU of Tennessee (ACLU-TN)

EAGLEVILLE – American Civil Liberties Union of Tennessee (ACLU-TN) announced today that Eagleville School Valedictorian Abe Stoklasa, accompanied by his mother, Gale, and ACLU-TN Staff Attorney Melody Fowler-Green, received his diploma from school officials this morning without further controversy.

School administrators withheld Stoklasa's diploma at the graduation ceremony last Friday after Stoklasa defied orders to edit his speech. A draft of his speech submitted for prior approval included jokes that the administration saw as critical of the school. One line said: "You have given us the minimum required attention and education that is needed to master any station at any McDonald's anywhere." This was immediately followed by: "Of course, I am only kidding. Eagleville is a fine institute of higher learning, with a superb faculty and staff." Eagleville Principal Rhonda Holton asked him to remove lines to which the administration objected.

Stoklasa believed his free speech rights were being violated and delivered his speech as initially proposed. The school shut down the sound system so that his remarks could not be heard and did not give him his diploma. When he didn't receive his diploma along with the other graduates, Stoklasa and his mother sought advice from ACLU-TN.

"I'm very glad to have my diploma. I worked hard for it and earned it. I don't think it's right to deny me that just for exercising my constitutional rights," said Stoklasa. "Ironically, in their attempt to censor me, my message got out to a bigger audience."

Fowler-Green expressed concern about the censorship: "Our educational system aims to teach students critical thinking. Abe's speech was thoughtful and respectful, while displaying a playful sense of critical analysis that I hope would make a school proud. Eagleville School should be very proud for producing a student who will stand up for himself and his rights the way Abe has."

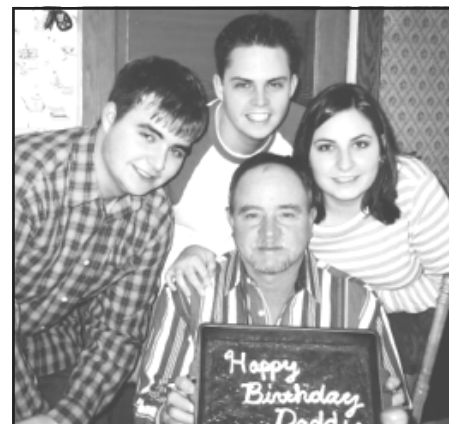

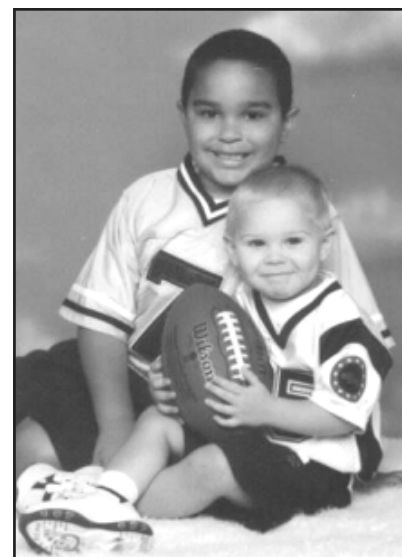
