### **Facebook Recipes**

#### Crust:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup butter, softened

#### 2nd Layer

- 1 cup pecan halves or chopped pecans 2/3 cup butter
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar1 cup milk chocolate morsels

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine first 3

ingredients in a mixing bowl; beat at medium speed with an electric mixer until blended. Pat mixture firmly into an ungreased 13x9 inch pan.

Arrange pecans over crust.

Combine 2/3 cup butter and 1/2 cup brown sugar in a saucepan; bring to a boil over medium high heat, stirring constantly. Cook 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Pour mixture over pecans. Bake at 350 degrees for 15-17 minutes or until golden and bubbly.

Remove from oven; sprinkle with chocolate morsels. Let stand 2-3 minutes or until slightly melted. Gently swirl chocolate with a knife, leaving some morsels whole (do not spread). Let cool on a wire rack at room temperature until chocolate is set. Cut into squares.



## Little Stories About You & Me By Nancy Allen

#### Summer Heat and Brown Leaves

Earlier in my life when it was 95 degrees in the shade somehow I didn't mind. I'm remembering the days of my youth when the

only relief from the heat was the big maple trees in our front yard and the funeral fans scattered through our old pre Civil War house. The ceilings had been lowered to make it easier to heat in the winter, but summers were just hot, making October a welcomed relief.

My husband from my youth was a "red neck" because his body was white except for his neck and hands which were dark brown or maybe even a little red from working outside in all kinds of weather.

I worked in the house, even so my pores were washed clean from sweating in the summer heat. People ate lots of salt, we needed it and boy did a drink of water from the deep cold well taste good. In those days water was our drink of choice.

Sitting on the front porch in the cool of the evening listening to night sounds such as crickets chirping before going to bed is a favorite memory. I loved listening to the frogs after settling in on the cool sheets—you could hear them because the windows were open. When the breeze blew through the room it was easy to relax and fade into satisfaction knowing even if it rained I would be safe with my husband by my side.

But now I'm alone. I sit here by my window, a 97 year old woman, no longer able to relax on the porch or tend to my yard as I did when I was young.

Look at my neighbor over there in his yard raking his leaves. He manicures that yard

Earlier in my life like it's a carpet in his house. I've never henitwas 95 degrees seen a man so obsessed with a lawn.

I wish I was younger—more supple. I was once like the green leaves of summer, flowing with sap, giving rise to the wind, giving shade to my neighbors—but not today. Today I'm like the dried up crusty leaves clinging to the trees, hanging on to life—my face is brown, wrinkled and crumbling.

Can't see what the old coot sees in me. He was over here just yesterday giving me what for—flirting if you asked me. But it will be a cold day in summer before he rakes my vard. I don't like him, never did even when we could go tumbling across the yard like the brown leaves. My yard is coveredover my shoe tops if I should go out there. Guess my leaves bother him. I don't care. I can't do anything about them. My nephew promised to rake my leaves this week. I hope he cleans out the flower bed. Brown leaves are gathered all around the dead plants. He said he would shred the leaves for his compost. They do make good dirt. Can you imagine something good coming out of something so dried up and ugly? New life—that's what it is—new life.

That's the door bell, he must be here. "Come in," I yelled from my chair. "The door's open."

"Hello, Aunt Millie, where do you want me to start?"

"Get the back yard. The leaves are thick there. They are even pilled up against the back neighbor's chain link fence. But you don't have to bother with the front. Just leave those leaves. When the west wind blows, my leaves will be the old coot's problem.


The Center is in for an extra treat because Pai is going to prepare an authentic Thai dish for the entrée. It's a chicken and rice recipe, not too spicy.
