The Eagleville Eye Clinic started out as a part time practice many years ago and grew into the full time office it is today.

Back in 2001 the office was only open two days a week. With a small space leased next to the Eagleville Medical Clinic the Eye Clinic consisted of Dr. Cron and one staff member. After a few years, it was necessary to increase the number of days for the office to be open and eventually, Dr. Cron evolved to seeing patients five days per week. As the Eye Clinic grew, it was necessary to add additional staff.

By 2009, it was apparent that the leased small space was insufficient to properly take care of patients. Dr. Cron was able to purchase the property next door and build the current facility. The Eagleville Eye Clinic relocated to the new building in March of 2010. As the clinic continues to grow, additional staff has been added to better serve patients.

The primary goal of the Eagleville Eye Clinic is to give patients the most thorough eye examination possible. "We want people to know that the health of their eyes is vital to good vision and I will do what I can to provide and maintain that for life," said Dr. Cron. The Eagleville Eye Clinic serves patients in Eagleville and the surrounding communities of

Rockvale, Chapel Hill, Unionville, College Grove, Bell Buckle, Triune and Arrington. ALL eye related problems are treated including eye infections, injuries, 'pink eye', and allergies. The eye clinic provides thorough retinal examinations for all patients with diabetes, glaucoma and high blood pressure. Dr. Cron works closely with several cataract and Lasik surgeons to provide all post-operative care for patients.

And finally, a large inventory of contact lenses, glasses, and sunglasses is available for patients to choose from to fit every budget and style. "Fitting contact lenses is my passion and I am always excited to introduce the latest products and technology, such as multifocal contacts lenses for people who need bifocals," said

Dr. Cron has personally been in practice in the middle Tennessee area for over 23 years. She is originally from Nashville, but has lived in Eagleville for over 18 years with her family.

Facebook Recipes Easiest Pecan Bars "EVER"

1 can (8 oz) refrigerated crescent rolls 3/4 cup chopped pecans

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup corn syrup

2 Tbsp butter or margarine, melted

1 tsp vanilla

1 egg, beaten

Heat oven to 350°F. Unroll dough and press in bottom and 1/2 inch up sides of a 9x13-inch pan. Firmly press perforations to seal. Bake 8 minutes.

Meanwhile, in medium bowl, mix

remaining ingredients. Pour filling over partially baked crust. Bake 18 to 22 minutes longer or until golden brown.

Cool completely, about 1 hour, and cut into bars.




